

Designed to...





Incentivize solar adoption on multifamily affordable housing



Install **300 megawatts** of generating capacity **by 2030**



Benefit owners and tenants



Increase energy efficiency + offset emissions

Funded through...

- Up to \$100 million annually over 10 years already allocated
- Funded by greenhouse gas auction proceeds, not taxpayer dollars
- 90% of total budget goes to incentives



Increasing access with...

- Minimum 51% of financial benefit directly to reduce tenant energy bills
- Required job training on each project
- 30% of SOMAH's active applications are in Disadvantaged Communities (DACs)*

*DACs are defined by <u>CalEnviroScreen</u>, SB 535



On properties with...



- At least **five** units
- **Deed-restricted** low-income residential housing
- Existing building or retrofit
- Virtual net metering with separately metered units
- Located in a disadvantaged community according to CalEnviroScreen 3.0
- or
- 80% of property residents have incomes at or below 60% of the area median income

Tenant Benefits & Education

- Guaranteed no rent increase
 to offset solar
- Required direct financial benefit to tenants through bill credits
- Creates awareness of changes
 associated with SOMAH
- Centers tenant community voices
- Informs tenants of SOMAH's benefits
- Introduces SOMAH's job training opportunities

Job Training

- SOMAH contractors are required to hire and pay 1-2 eligible job trainees for each SOMAH project.
- Types of positions include:
- PV installation
- Project design/engineering
- PV commissioning and maintenance
- SOMAH wage floor = 1.4x local minimum wage

How SOMAH is working with Government

- Partnership in outreach efforts
- Co-marketing/co-branding on materials, websites
